
YEAR ONE <u>Newsletter</u>

English

We have been reading 'Alan's big, scary teeth' in English this week. The children have enjoyed describing Alan the alligator and inventing ways to help Alan find his false teeth. In SPaG, the children have been sequencing pictures from well-known stories, such as The Three Little Pigs.



Maths

We continued looking at numbers to 50 this week. The children used tens and ones to partition numbers to 50. They also practised drawing their own pictures to represent how many tens and ones were in each number. Next, we used 100 squares to help us identify one more and one less than a number to 50.

Science

This week, we learnt about different types of wild plants. We made the most of the lovely weather and went around the school grounds to see what different types of wild plants we could spot.





Religious Education

We learnt about Easter Sunday when Jesus came back to life. We discussed why eggs are a symbol of Easter and how they represent the stone that was covering Jesus's tomb, as well as representing new life. We also talked about how a cracked egg represents Jesus's empty tomb.
