English

This week in SPAG we looked at capital letters. This time we discussed when we need to use capital letters, for example, at the beginning of a sentence, the name of a person, a place, name of the months of the year and days of the week.

We have been having a real focus on handwriting. The children need to ensure their letters are formed correctly and that they are writing each letter with lead in lines and lead out lines. This will help when the children start writing cursively.
