Listed below are 20 different activities relating to our Ancient Egypt topic. You must complete 4 of the 20 activities. However, if you wish to choose more, then you are welcome to do so!

You must choose to display your work anyway that you like. For example, a book, a booklet, posters, Power Points or a combination of any of these.

Research & write about Tutankhamen. Draw a picture of the pharaoh Tutankhamen to enhance your writing.	Invent a new set of hieroglyphics and write them out. Use them to write your name or create messages for your friends to decode.	Split an A4 sheet into 8 squares and draw an animated sketch (cartoon) about daily life in ancient Egypt.	Construct a pyramid using any suitable materials. You could use Lego bricks, unifix cubes, sugar cubes or cardboard.	Think of ways that river Nile could be used on a poster to promote the message of a cleaner environment or reducing river pollution.
List ten things that you would not see in Ancient Egypt compared to modern Egypt. Justify your suggestions.	List ten things you might see in Ancient Egypt but not in modern day Egypt.	Neatly write down ten questions you might ask Tutankhamen or queen Cleopatra or Ramesses II.	Design a leaflet to encourage tourists to visit Egypt.	Write a playscript set in ancient Egypt.
Compose a poem in relation to the topic of ancient Egypt.	Create a simple game based on ancient Egypt e.g. snap, snakes & ladders or a guessing game.	Compose an acrostic poem using the words Ancient Egypt or Tutankhamen or Cleopatra.	Create a word search about ancient Egypt.	Create a poster or information booklet based on mummification.
Make a 3D model of a typical home during ancient Egyptian times.	Explore the food eaten by ancient Egyptians. Draw & label a table laid out for dinner or create a 3-course menu based on it.	Draw a picture of a new Egyptian god or goddess. Write a few sentences about them.	Explore the games played by Egyptian children and present your information in an interesting way.	Free choice.
