# Year 3 Newsletter



#### **English**

This week in English, we continued using the text 'Flotsam' to develop our skills of inference. The children loved this task and came up with very impressive ideas, thoughts and questions about the intriguing pictures.








#### Maths

This week in maths, we studied the different kinds of fractions. The children now know that the difference between a unit fraction and a non-unit fraction is the digit in the numerator. If the numerator is one, the fraction is a unit fraction. Non-unit fractions have numerators that are anything other than one. If the numerator and the denominator is the same, the fraction represents one whole. The children also compared and ordered fractions.



$$\frac{\frac{1}{3}}{\frac{1}{3}} \qquad \frac{1}{3} + \frac{1}{3} + \frac{1}{3} = \frac{3}{3} \qquad \frac{\frac{3}{3} = 1 \text{ whole}}{\frac{1}{2}}$$

$$\frac{1}{2} \qquad \frac{1}{2} + \frac{1}{2} = \frac{2}{2} \qquad \frac{\frac{2}{2} = 1 \text{ whole}}{\frac{1}{4}}$$


