


Dear Parents and Carers.

English

We have completed analysing the book Into the Forest, by Anthony Browne, this week. The children answered questions about the rest of the book and commented on the ending of the story. We then looked closely at the use of colours in the book and wrote our own ideas about the impact colour has on a reader.



We also analysed the change in the emotions of the main character through some of the events of the story. This helped children to see how the author takes the reader on an emotional roller coaster through the book, ending with feelings of relief and joy.






<u>Maths</u>

This week in maths, we studied multiples of ten and one hundred. The children now know that when a number is multiplied by ten, it gets ten times bigger and moves up a place value. Similarly, when multiplied by a hundred, the number gets a hundred times bigger and moves up two place values.


Based on all that we have learnt so far in the term, we solved reasoning problems.



<u>RE</u>

This week in RE, the children learnt about some the symbols that are important to Sikh believers.






The children really enjoyed handling and exploring some of the religious artefacts that are displayed in the class. They showed great respect towards these objects as they learnt about them.

<u>History</u>

We studied the Egyptian timeline in our history lesson. We first made a virtual timeline using a rope, to understand how to interpret it. Children put some key historic events in the correct places along the timeline (birth of Jesus Christ, current year, the year(s) that the children in Year 3 were born in, the great fire of London, sinking of the Titanic, completion of the Taj Mahal and

the stone age period). Then, they completed a sheet with the key events of the Egyptian civilization.





<u>PE</u>

We have continued to develop our ball skills by playing games of dodgeball and bench ball. I have been very impressed with the whole class for showing great sportsmanship and team work during our PE sessions.

<u>Science</u>

Children investigated the effects of friction on a moving vehicle. They made a car move over different surfaces and measured the length travelled. They predicted what might happen,

recorded their results and wrote a conclusion to the investigation.
