On Monday, we had an enjoyable assembly on building resilience and on the importance of good mental health. We learnt that using




less technology, eating healthy balanced food, doing physical exercises, getting a good night's sleep, and talking about our feelings are five ways of improving our mental health along with our physical health.

We focussed on improving our grammar knowledge this week in English. The children learnt that compound sentences have two main clauses connected by a coordinating conjunction (for example, *but*, *or*, *and*, *so*, *etc*.) and complex sentences have a main clause and a subordinating clause connected by subordinating conjunction (for example, *when*, *since*, *because*, *while*, *however*, *etc*.).
