
# Year 3 Newsletter

Monday was our Art Day! The artist we studied was Pablo Picasso. The children learnt about his life, his most important pieces of work and his immense contribution to the evolution of artistic style.

Based on Picasso's style of Cubism, the children first created a piece of art showing a face from two perspectives. Use of bold and contrasting colours gave the pictures a striking effect. The children loved this activity and created some impressive pieces of art. Here are some of the examples of their work.

# <u>Geography</u>

We have continued our learning about settlements. The children learnt the difference between a hamlet, a village, a town and a city. They studied the bird's eye view of two villages in England and compared them.
