## English

In English this week, the children answered comprehension questions about the first chapter of *The Sheep-Pig*. We learnt what similes are, and the children wrote some examples of similes in their books. We also learnt how to use prepositions in our writing.



## Maths

In maths this week, we have learnt how to find unit and non-unit fractions of a set of objects.

1 Draw counters in the bar models to help you complete each number sentence. The first one has been done for you.

a)  $\frac{1}{2}$  of 8 =  A horizontal bar divided into 8 equal segments, each containing a red counter.

b)  $\frac{1}{2}$  of 16 =  A horizontal bar divided into 16 equal segments, all empty.

c)  $\frac{1}{4}$  of 8 =  A horizontal bar divided into 8 equal segments, all empty.

d)  $\frac{1}{4}$  of 16 =  A horizontal bar divided into 16 equal segments, all empty.

1 Draw counters in the bar models to help you complete each number sentence.

a)  $\frac{1}{3}$  of 15 =  A horizontal bar divided into 15 equal segments, all empty.

b)  $\frac{1}{4}$  of 8 =  A horizontal bar divided into 8 equal segments, all empty.

c)  $\frac{1}{5}$  of 20 =  A horizontal bar divided into 20 equal segments, all empty.
