
English

To complete our study of the text Into the Forest, we wrote a book review this week. The children rated the book and expressed their opinion about it. They explained the reason for recommending or for not recommending the book to others. Finally, they found out facts about the famous author of the text, Anthony Browne and recorded it in their books.



Maths

We have learnt a new concept this week in maths – multiplying and dividing a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number. We learnt the formal written method of solving these problems. We first partitioned the 2-digit number into its tens and ones. Then we multiplied these by the 1-digit

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number. Finally, these answers need to be added up to solve the problem.

Since this method requires the use of several mathematical skills and is worked out in three stages, some children found it tricky. We will keep revisiting this part of our learning in the coming months.

Some children grasped this concept. They are now applying the same principles to column multiplication. The children really need to

consolidate this before moving on to dividing formally.

Your help in practising similar problems at home will be appreciated. A work sheet with problems to solve will be sent home this week. I understand that I have set this homework at short notice, but I have spoken to the children and reassured them that this homework will only help them in their maths work next week and it need not be returned to school. They can solve the problems whenever they have the time, over the coming week. They can also choose to use either the partitioning method or the column method.

In science this week, the children learnt how to observe rock samples closely and record their observations during our study of the topic, Rocks and Soils.












Miss Atkinson was in our class this week for work experience. She was brilliant at helping the children in their learning in all subjects.
