Music

This year, we are lucky enough to have Mr Jaggard teaching the children how to play the ukulele. These sessions will begin next Tuesday (12/09/21). If the children have their own ukulele, they are welcome to bring them in on a Tuesday in a named case. We will have lessons with Mr Jaggard from term 1 through to, and including, term 4.



PE (Wednesday and Friday afternoons)

For our PE sessions this term, we will cover tag rugby and dance. We spent our first PE session doing whole class games and we had a long play time after that. It was far too hot to do any more than that! In our second PE session, children were put into groups and we played the game of defending the team whilst scoring points of our own team.


Our science topic for this term is Animals including Humans. We will be studying the groups of food and their importance to a healthy living. We will also discuss healthy lifestyles and the impact of exercises on our bodies. The structure and function of the muscles and the bones in humans will also be a part of our study. This week, we discussed and recorded what we already know about the topic and what we would like to find out.



Maths

For the next few weeks, we will cover place value in our maths lessons. This week, we used base-10 to make, draw and represent different 2 and 3-digit numbers. Then, we practised partitioning numbers into hundreds, tens and ones by thinking about the value of each digit. We used part- whole models to partition numbers. To the right is an example of how we can represent numbers in number form, words, addition sums and using resources (using base 10).

We re-capped our learning from Year 2 to ensure that all of the important objectives from that year group had been met in order for us to access the Year 3 learning confidently. We will do this throughout the year to ensure the children have covered all learning required.



English

This week, we started the week with some free writing. We have practised our cursive writing almost every day. The children were encouraged to think of the activities they did, places they visited and people they met during the summer holidays. They drew pictures for each one of these to gather their thoughts and wrote down key vocabulary and spellings of names of places. Many children have done the diary entries for their holidays. This has helped them enormously in their writing task. It is wonderful to see that all the children have had a great summer! We will begin our text-based lessons next week.

RE

We revisited the story of Noah's Ark in our RE lesson. The children discussed the events of the story and God's promise to Noah. We talked about the importance of keeping a promise and the consequences to others if a promise is broken.

Times Tables

Times tables tests will be done on Tuesdays. Results for these will come home with the children once the sheets are marked. We will begin testing on Tuesday 12th September. The sheets might seem easy in the beginning. But please bear in mind that we are trying to build children's confidence and quick recall of the times tables facts. They will be encouraged to beat their own time. Children will be tested on multiplication and related division facts.
