# **English**


The children have also been practising the correct use of quotation marks in our SPaG lessons.


## **Maths**


In Maths, Year Four have been labelling, identifying and finding missing values on blank or partially completed number lines up to 10,000.

They have also been exploring efficient methods to use when subtracting numbers. The children now know that if the two numbers in a subtraction problem are close to each other, counting **up** from the smaller number to the larger number or counting back from the larger number to the smaller number (finding the difference) is more efficient than column subtraction.

$$3,008 - 2,990 = 18$$







They also learnt other efficient methods of subtraction. Here are two visual examples.

Subtracting one from the larger number and adding it to the answer will give us the difference between the two numbers.

Or...

Subtracting one from both, the larger and the smaller number, will give us the difference between the two numbers!

#### <u>History</u>

On Monday, Year Four created fact files for the Colosseum. The children made simple, quick notes after watching videos and listening to Power Points on the Colosseum and they then turned these jottings into formative, factual sentences.
