<u>PE</u>

<u>History</u>

This week, we learnt about Hengist and Horsa. Hengist and Horsa are Germanic brothers said to have led the Angles, Saxons and Jutes in their supposed invasion of Britain in the 5th century. Tradition lists Hengist as the first of the Jutish kings of Kent. The children wrote persuasive letters to King Vortigern, arguing the case for Hengist and Horsa to be allowed the region of Kent after all of their heroic fighting for Britain.

<u>Art</u>

We painted our final pieces based on Kandinsky's Concentric Circles. They look absolutely fabulous and will be displayed proudly in the classroom. Well done, Year Four.

<u>English</u>

In English, the children have started to create a presidential campaign for our persuasive writing topic. They will write a speech, convincing the class to vote for them to become the



class president. The president will have to be an outstanding role model and will have a little bit of input into our learning for the week. They thought about their own values and characteristics that would make them a good leader for the class. After that, we started writing our speeches. Next week, the children will edit and present their speeches to the class.




We have also been studying the features of a playscript (drama texts). We read an extract from Macbeth and wrote a comparative note on stories and scripts.

We have also learnt to fill in the missing numbers on a number line with mixed numbers.




Geography
