Dear Parents

Happy New Year! I hope you had a wonderful family Christmas time and that the children are refreshed and ready for the new term.

This week in maths, we have worked on short and long multiplication. All the children are confident with the methods now, but several are a little slow, or make errors, because they do not have instant recall of their times tables facts. Please do help your child to become really confident, if they are not already, by regularly calling out questions for them to answer - "What is 6x8?" etc. We do plenty of tables challenges in school, but practising at home makes a massive difference. If children can instantly recall multiplication and division facts, it genuinely will make maths easier for their whole school life and beyond!

In English, we have started to study Shakespeare's play 'A Midsummer Night's Dream.' First, the children wrote a formal discussion text in the form of a monologue, with Hermia considering whether she should marry Demetrius, or run away with Lysander. Then, the children wrote the story of the 'play within the play', which has the very catchy title of 'The Most Lamentable Comedy and Most Cruel Death of Pyramus and Thisbe!'



We have a new science topic this term, which is Earth and Space. We began by considering how, in ancient times, people believed the Earth was flat, then looked at the evidence which proves that it is, in fact, a spherical body. In PE, we played bench ball, in Geography the children began to learn about The Amazon, and in RE we are studying the concept of People of God, starting with Moses
