Dear Parents

This week in maths, the children did lots more work converting between improper fractions and mixed numbers, until they were really confident. We moved on to looking at number sequences with fractions, before starting to compare two fractions by finding common denominators – this is tricky and it will take a few lessons to really master.

In English, the children wrote pieces of narrative titled 'The Hunter,' which built up tension. It was only in the final paragraph that the hunter and victim were revealed to be a cat and a mouse! The children worked incredibly hard and were very proud of the writing that they produced. They also wrote a set of instructions for how to catch a pigeon.

In science this week, we looked at the features of houses. For each feature, the children said what material it was made of, what the properties of that material are, and why those properties make it suitable for its purpose.

This week is Anti-Bullying Week. In PSHE, the children acted out scenarios and created acrostic poems on the theme of respect. Year 5 led a whole-school Act of Worship on this subject too.

Today, the children have designed a Tudor purse or money pouch. They will be making them on Monday. They also had fun playing team games with balloons in the hall, as the theme of this year's Children in Need is 'Make Life Lighter.' Thank you for supporting this very worthy cause.
