
# Year 5 Newsletter

#### Dear Parents

This week in maths, we worked on thousandths as decimals, rounding decimals, ordering and comparing decimals and adding decimals. In English, we had a week of poetry. First, the children studied the poem 'If by Rudyard Kipling. They then looked at the poem 'The Raven' by Edgar Allen Poe and the class learnt to recite the first verse off by heart - I wonder if your child can still remember it! Finally, the children wrote a pair of poems called 'The Mirror of Wishes' and 'The Mirror of Despair'. In geography, the children learnt about the animals of the rainforest and in science, we found out about water resistance, and carried out an investigation related to the effect of objects being streamlined. In RE, the children had to consider all the people who were responsible for the death of Jesus, then they had to decide how much responsibility lay with each person or group of people. As always, many interesting discussions took place.

Linked to our poetry work, the children followed a Youtube tutorial to draw a raven. I thought the results were excellent!
