The children have worked really hard this week and achieved a great deal – I am so delighted with them! This week in maths, the children worked on rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000. They compared and ordered numbers to 1 million and represented numbers in different ways, before counting in 10s, 100s, 1000s, 10,000s and 100,000s. In English, the children wrote descriptive court reports about a criminal in Tudor times. They acted out a Tudor market scene from our class book, before writing really excellent, detailed descriptions of a walk through the Tudor market.

In history, we learnt about how the Tudor period began, with the Battle of Bosworth and in science the children considered states of matter, revising how water changes state when it freezes, melts, evaporates and condenses.





In RE, we studied the parable of The Good Samaritan. Finally, in geography, the children learnt about oceans and trade.
