Year 5 Newsletter

Dear Parents

Welcome back! I hope everyone had a lovely Easter break. This week in maths, we began a new block of work about decimals. To begin with, the children added and subtracted decimals within one, then moved on to 'complements to 1', in other words, pairs of numbers which make 1, such as 0.45 + 0.55 or 0.367 + 0.633. Lots of children found this surprisingly difficult, so it would be a great thing to practise at home. Finally, we added decimals with totals more than 1. In English, we completed our work on 'A Midsummer Night's Dream.' The children wrote fantastic descriptions of a magical wood setting. They then planned and independently wrote a story called 'Bottom's Dream.' I am using this piece of work to accurately assess the children's current level in writing.

Our science topic for this term is 'Living things and their Habitats.' We began by finding out about sexual and asexual reproduction in plants and we learnt about the different parts of a flower. We had a good gymnastics PE lesson and some fabulous games of quick-fire cricket. Finally, we will be learning about Islam in RE for the rest of this year, so we began by finding out about important beliefs for Muslims.
