
Year 5 Newsletter

Dear Parents

This week in maths, the children have compared fractions with different denominators and added and subtracted fractions. In order to carry out these operations, there are a lot of steps to remember, and I have been really impressed with how well the children have done. In English, detailed letters of persuasion were written and comprehension questions about the next chapters of our class books were answered. In science, the children discovered why the sun appears to travel across the sky.

In geography, in addition to continuing to learn about migration, the children found out about the different levels of the rainforest, presenting their findings beautifully. They then followed a YouTube tutorial, so that they could draw a realistic toucan.
