Dear Parents

This week in maths, we used line graphs to solve problems, we read and interpreted 2-way tables and we did lots of work on timetables, first ensuring that the children understood 24-hour clock and that they could work out the difference between two times. In English, we read to the end of 'Journey to the River Sea' and then began our new class text, 'Kensuke's Kingdom' by Michael Morpurgo. The children answered some comprehension questions and then wrote a detailed discussion text about whether or not eleven-year old Michael, his parents and their dog should set off to sail around the world. In addition to this, we have focused on co-ordinating and subordinating conjunctions, pronouns and possessive pronouns, and homophones in our SPaG work

In science, the children continued to learn about forces. They then began our DT project, which is to design and make a musical instrument which makes at least three different sounds. In RE, we learnt about The Five Pillars of Islam and heard the story of Bilal, the first Muezzin. It has certainly been a lovely week weather-wise, so we had two great PE sessions: athletics and rounders. Mrs Ward has begun to teach the children some French, instead of Italian, so they are able to say a few words and phrases when we go on our trip!
