This week in maths, the children found the area of rectangles and compound shapes. We realised that with more tricky dimensions, the children needed to use long multiplication, which they hadn't yet been taught, so they also learnt how to do those trickier multiplication calculations. In English, we read a lot of our class text and wrote a set of instructions for how to catch a pigeon. We also did some reading comprehension tasks and spelling work. Our history lesson this week focused on The Mary Rose. We found out about this famous Tudor ship, how it was sunk and how it was eventually raised again. The children looked at pictures of artefacts which were found on the wreckage, to see what they could teach us about what life onboard had been like. The children also designed a Tudor money pouch, which they will be making in Design Technology.
