Dear Parents

It certainly feels like Christmas is coming in school! We have started rehearsing the songs for our KS2 nativity in earnest, as there are a lot to learn, but there has been plenty of time for hard work too.

In maths, we are continuing our fractions work. The children have compared and ordered fractions greater than one, added and subtracted fractions with common denominators, and added fractions with different denominators. In English, the children did a reading comprehension assessment, the results of which I can share with you in the parent consultations next week. They wrote a detailed descriptive recount and we have read to the end of 'Varjak Paw.' We still have one more written task related to the book to complete next week, but the children have certainly enjoyed the story. If you'd like an idea for a small extra Christmas present for your child, there is a sequel to this book, called 'The Outlaw Varjak Paw' by SF Said.

Other lessons this week have included hockey and yoga PE sessions, designing a lunchbox to keep food cool in science, learning more about oceans in geography and continuing to look at the 'Big Bible Story' in $\mathcal{R}\mathcal{F}$.

new team name and badge for Hogwarts. It was a great exercise for having to work cooperatively.
