This week in maths, the children solved some more addition and subtraction word problems. We then started our next unit of learning about statistics, reading line graphs and organising data in frequency tables.

In English, we read our class book set in Tudor times, where our young, poor hero had to joust against the champion jouster of France. Having acted out the events (with some hílaríty) the children wrote really detailed, creative recounts. This took a few lessons, but the results were really excellent.




In science, we carried out some activities to investigate irreversible changes.



First, we fried an egg, then we mixed warm milk and vinegar to create a new material called casein plastic. Finally, we put vinegar in a plastic bottle and filled a balloon with bicarbonate of soda. We stretched the balloon over the neck of the bottle and let the bicarbonate of soda tip into the vinegar. The chemical reaction between the two materials created

carbon dioxide, which rather dramatically inflated the balloon!
