Stationery supplies

I will begin to allow children to write with pens after Christmas, as long as their handwriting is really good. A pen or two may make a good stocking filler. We ask that the children use any pens with dark blue ink, except biros, as these require too much pressure to write with.

We recommend these pens: Pentel Energel 0.7mm Metal Point , as they last quite a long time and don't tend to smudge.



Personally, I always use Pilot V-ball 0.5 liquid ink rollerball pens for all my planning and marking, as I find that they flow nicely and they also last a long time,



We greatly appreciate the fact that parents have provided resources for the children again this year and it has been noticeable how much better the children have been at looking after their own equipment. Of course, we always provide anything that the children need to carry out their work, if they don't have their own supplies.
