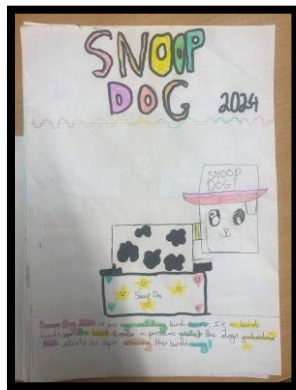
English:
