Dear Parents,

I cannot believe we have only been back at school for three weeks – so much has happened! Years 5 and 6 had an amazing time on Monday singing as part of the Young Voices choir. We were so proud of all of them! It was a long day but they were all amazing! Thank you so much to the adults who gave up their evening to come with us (Mrs Grinstead, Mrs Spratt, Miss Reddick, Mrs Siverland-Bishop, Mrs Ward, Mrs Brown and Mrs Smith), and who joined in so enthusiastically!

#### Entering through the school office / Interventions

Some children benefit from early morning interventions, with teachers and teaching assistants. We do appreciate your support with this, and for ensuring the children are here on time for a prompt start. Please can I ask, however, that your children do not arrive more than 5 minutes before the stated time of the intervention we simply cannot guarantee having staff available to supervise them, or sufficient space for them to wait, if they arrive too early.

Similarly, if your child arrives through the front door, rather than the playground gate, please can we ask that they arrive between 8:40am and 8:50am? Again, we do not have staff available to greet them before this time. Thank you for your support and understanding.

#### Illness...

Unfortunately, it is that time of year when horrible bugs and viruses are prevalent. This year we seem to have some extremely nasty sickness bugs doing the rounds. *Please, please keep your children home from school for a full 48 hours from the last bout of sickness or diarrhoea.* I know 48 hours seems like a long time, especially if your child feels better, or if you need to get back to work, but please do think of others and keep your child off until 48 hours have passed. The viruses that are around at the moment are very contagious, and last week we really struggled to staff the school sufficiently to remain open, as so many staff members were affected.

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This is also the time when we may need to contact you to ask you to collect your child from school. We only send children home from school if they are genuinely unwell, in which case it is important both that we are able to contact you quickly, and also that there is someone nearby who is able to collect your child quickly. We quite understand that it is not easy to juggle childcare when parents work, but would really appreciate having sufficient emergency contacts to call on when a child needs to go home. Poorly children really do not want to sitting outside the school office whilst we try to get hold of someone for them. If you would like to check, update or add to your child's emergency contacts, you can do this on the Arbor app, and let us know of any changes you would like to make. ## Reviews

As some of you may know, Mark Cole was appointed as the new CEO of Tenax Schools' Trust in September 2024. To support Mark as he works to get to know all of the schools in the Trust, a number of reviews have been commissioned for this year, each looking at a different aspect of school life. To date we have had reviews looking at Inclusion and our support of pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium Funding. These reviews are both thorough and collaborative, and offer our staff and children the opportunity to share what we do here at Leybourne. I am delighted to share with you just a few of the comments that have been made following these reviews:

-School is calm and settled. Behaviours for learning are positive and underpinned by warm and nurturing relationships between staff and pupils.

-Impact of Speech & Language provision on younger pupils' reading is a strength e.g. PP pupils in Year 1 who are clearly developing their vocabularies and able to decode more speedily as mapping between known phonemes and known vocabulary quickly and effectively.

-A clear and consistent approach to the teaching of phonics was seen during the visit. This included providing effective 1:1 teaching right from the start for particular children, which has meant that some children with complex SEND needs have effectively been prevented from falling behind in the first place.

-(I saw) a very strong sense of inclusion within the school, with individual pupils known extremely well, and clear curriculum adaptation for those with pronounced SEND.

It is lovely to see the hard work of the staff, and their commitment to the children, being recognised in this way.
