We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all pupils. We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed. We believe that all pupils should benefit from the funding, regardless of their level of sporting ability. The most effective way to ensure a lasting and positive impact of the funding on PE provision throughout the school is to develop teachers' skill and confidence in the teaching of the subject.

Summary of SPG spending 2019/20

The Sports Premium Funding this year was used to specifically support the stated aim of "encouraging the development of healthy, active lifestyles". Much attention was paid to the promotion of active before school, break and lunch times, through the provision of enhanced physical resources, play spaces and positive role models. In addition, we continued to support the development of the Physical Education curriculum, primarily through the improved provision of opportunities for outdoor and adventurous activity challenges, both individually and within a team. Our fully trained and accredited Forest Schools' Practitioner continued to develop and lead a programme of outdoor and adventurous activity challenges, which was also followed by members of the teaching staff in order for them to further develop their skills and confidence in this area. Existing school staff were supported to provide an increased range of outdoor and adventurous activity challenges, throughout the course of the school day, maximising pupils' physical activity during break and lunchtimes.

Outcomes to date:

Forest School continues to develop pupils' resilience, stamina and motivation. Teachers and teaching assistants report increased confidence in leading outdoor and adventurous learning activities as a result.

School involvement in PASS events has increased, leading to higher numbers of pupils having access to a wider range of sporting activities.

Pupils have access to a wider choice of physical activities and resources before school, and at break and lunchtimes.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Breakfast Club and Lunchtime staff were deployed to cover individual bubbles, and worked with reduced numbers of children during periods of partial school closure. In addition, it was not possible to have the Chute apparatus installed. Therefore, some planned expenditure (£12900) will be carried forward to 2020-2021.
