## **Principles**

# At Leybourne Ss Peter and Paul C E Primary School:

- We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of the pupils.
- We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed.
- We believe that all pupils should benefit from the funding, regardless of their level of sporting ability.
- The most effective way to ensure a lasting and positive impact of the funding on PE provision throughout the school is to develop teachers' skill and confidence in the teaching of the subject.

# Review of SPG spending 2014/15

During 2014/15 £6024 of the Sports Premium Grant was used to fund a shared Specialist PE teacher to lead lessons, whilst the Class Teacher supported children and observed the specialist teacher. The next lesson was taught by the class teacher as a follow up, giving them an opportunity to practise strategies and techniques they observed in the previous lesson. This led to teaching staff reporting increased confidence in the teaching of PE. Assessment procedures were developed with the support of the specialist PE teacher and will be used as the basis for the new method of reporting attainment in PE to parents. The remaining money was spent on purchasing additional resources to improve the quality of our PE provision. Pupils benefitted from more focussed teaching, based on accurate assessment of their skills and abilities.

### Summary of SPG spending 2015/16

#### The range of provision within our school to date includes:

The Sports Premium Funding this year has been used to specifically support the Key Stage 2 Physical Education curriculum, primarily through the improved provision of opportunities for outdoor and adventurous activity challenges, both individually and within a team. The Forest Schools team are visiting for a week in March 2016 to lead a programme of outdoor and adventurous activity challenges, which will be adopted by members of the teaching staff in order for them to further develop their skills and confidence in this area.

The PE Leader is new to post and will be attending training on a range of PE topics. She will then share the outcomes of this training with the rest of the staff through leading INSET and team teaching. Sports premium funding has also been used to subsidise pupil attendance at a range of extracurricular sports clubs held at the school.

#### **Future plans for PE provision:**

Existing school staff to provide an increased range of outdoor and adventurous activity challenges both individually and within a team.

Further priorities and plans for development will be identified following the training to be attended by the PE Leader.
