# **Uniform Policy**

#### **Approval Arrangements**

All statutory policies in the Trust are ultimately the responsibility of the Trust Board. To enable it to discharge this responsibility appropriately and in collaboration with the constituent schools, the Trust Board will

- 1. set a full Trust wide policy,
- 2. set a 'policy principles' document (a framework within which Headteachers develop a full and appropriately customised policy).
- 3. or delegate to Headteachers or LGBs the power to develop their own policy.

## 1. Introduction and Context

At Leybourne Ss Peter and Paul CEP Academy, we aim to nurture the spark of God within each member of our community. We provide our pupils with high quality learning opportunities, that allow us all to achieve our full potential in all we do, and to grow into well-rounded citizens of the world. Through embodying our Core Christian Values of Love, Trust, Compassion and Respect in everything we do, we aim to build a safe and joyful community with God.

We work hard to ensure that we recognise and celebrate the uniqueness of each individual and seek to eliminate discrimination, harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is prohibited by or under the Equality Act (2010). We believe a school uniform is important in building pupils' sense of identity and belonging to the community of the school. It instils a sense of pride in the school, promotes the ethos of the school, and supports positive behaviour. By creating a common identity amongst all pupils, regardless of background, a school uniform can act as a social leveller, protecting pupils from social pressures whatever their race, religion, gender or background. It can reduce bullying and peer pressure to wear the latest fashions or other expensive clothes.

## 3. Cost and Availability

Leybourne Ss Peter and Paul CE Academy is committed to meeting the DFE's recommendations on costs and value for money in order to ensure that the School Uniform Policy does not discourage parents/carers from applying for a school place for their child. We will work with parent groups to ensure that there are opportunities for parents to acquire second-hand school uniforms, and will publish details on the school website. The use of branded uniform items (including optional items) are kept to a minimum, and we consider the total costs of uniform, including PE kits. We work to ensure that our school uniform suppliers give the highest priority to costs and value for money, including quality and durability.

# 4. Uniform rationale

The uniform is based on meeting the following criteria:

- creating a shared identity and common sense of purpose
- comfortable to wear
- the PE kit is practical, comfortable and appropriate for the activity
- our obligations under the Equality Act 2010 and Human Rights Act 1998
- safeguarding and health and safety considerations
- engaging with parents and pupils before introducing significant changes

• cost and value for money are a high priority

We aim to be considerate in the implementation of the uniform policy and to make reasonable adjustments as appropriate. We will be sensitive to accommodating these needs, without compromising school policies such as school safety or discipline.

# 5. Uniform

We ask that ALL items of school clothing are named in order to help your child identify their clothing.

A selection of second hand uniform is available to purchase from the school. Please email <u>uniform@leybourne.school</u> for further details. We also publish information on the school website.

Shoulder length or longer hair should be tied back during school hours.

Jewellery is not permitted with the exception of small plain stud earrings, which children must remove before participating in PE lessons. If you are considering having your child's ears pierced, please do so at the beginning of the summer holiday to allow them time to heal and to avoid impacting on their participation in PE.
