Summary of SPG spending 2021/22

The Sports Premium Funding this year was used to specifically support the stated aim of "encouraging the development of healthy, active lifestyles". Much attention was paid to the promotion of active break and lunch times, through the provision of enhanced physical resources, play spaces and positive role models. We are also developing the outdoor environment to provide further additional play equipment and safety matting for pupils to use during break and lunch times.

Outcomes (reviewed in July 2022):

Despite delays with supplier availability and the provision of materials, the fencing work to secure the Woodland Learning area and the preliminary installation of the Chute playground equipment has commenced. Playtimes and lunchtimes have proved to be successful in terms of children accessing play equipment and activities,

and play leaders have worked with younger children to teach them playground games and encourage physical activity. Woodland Learning continues to inspire and engage pupils, with notably high levels of physical activity seen in all classes when pupils grasp the opportunity to devise their own games and activities in the woods.
