Dear Parents,

We have only been back a week, but what a busy one it has been! The children have been learning about multiples, factors, common multiples and common factors in their maths lessons. This has been a learning curve for the children and so we will spend a little longer on this next week to consolidate their understanding.

In English, the children are completing longer pieces of writing and getting used to using a success criteria to support their understanding of what is expected in that piece of writing. It is great to be able to share previous examples of Year 5 writing with the children to spur them on to enhance their writing skills further.

In Science, the children watched some investigations looking at irreversible changes with different materials. They particularly enjoyed watching a ballon inflate using only a bottle of vinegar and some bicarbonate of soda.

Next week on Wednesday, the children will have their Tudor Day. They don't have to dress up at all, but if they aren't, could you please ensure that your child is wearing school uniform. I look forward to updating you on your child's progress at the upcoming parent's evenings.
